About SOAG ...

SOAG was established in 1969 and now has about 140 members. Its main aims are to promote an active interest in archaeology & allied disciplines, particularly in South Oxfordshire. It works in close cooperation with the County Archaeologist & Oxford Archaeology, is a member of the Council for Independent Archaeology & is affiliated to the Council for British Archaeology South Midlands Group. SOAG has done fieldwork with Reading University Archaeological Department & the Oxfordshire Victoria County History.

Lectures and visits: we hold monthly meetings from September to April. Lectures by professional speakers & members are given on a wide range of topics in an informal atmosphere. Field trips & visits are made to places of interest; sometimes sites not open to the public.

Fieldwork: we provide opportunities for members to take part in archaeological excavations, surveys and "geophys", field-walking and post-excavation work.

Publications: SOAG publishes a journal, the *SOAG Bulletin*, which contains reports of the group's activities & original articles by members. At the time of writing our excavation of the earthwork enclosure at Wyfold Grange has been completed.

In September we will be returning for the second year to Smokedown, in West Oxfordshire. The 2021 fieldwork established evidence for significant Late Iron Age and Romano-British occupation.
